The safe and appropriate use of blood and alternatives to donor blood are important public health and clinical governance issues for everyone involved in healthcare.

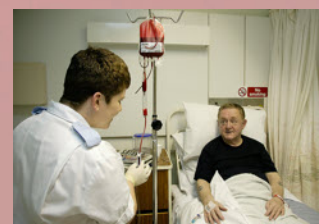
NHS Blood and Transplant are holding a one day National Conference for

### The Venue

The Town Hall is a Grade 1 listed landmark that has been lovingly and painstakingly renovated and is situated in Victoria Square at the top of New Street.

### By Road

Birmingham is at the hub of a comprehensive motorway network that connects to every corner of the country via the M5, M6, M40 and M42. Follow signs to Birmingham City Centre then follow the brown tourist signs to the Convention Centre and NIA. (Town Hall and Symphony Hall themselves are not featured on road signage.)

**Parking:** Holliday Street and Brunel Street car parks are all within walking distance of Town Hall.

### By Rail

Birmingham New Street and Snow Hill stations are within easy walking distance of Town Hall. Moor Street and Five Ways are slightly further away but still within walking distance. (NB Birmingham International serving Birmingham International Airport and The NEC, is approximately 10 miles away).
